Dear Parent/Carers

We hope you have all had a great summer. We are really looking forward to seeing the children again and to try to get back to some normality in September.

The first day of term will be Monday 7th September, however we will be at the setting on Friday 4th September from 9am till 12pm if you would like to pop in and see us with your child. As the children have not been here since March, we thought it may be a nice way to re-introduce them to the staff and to see the changes we have made. We will have set the rooms up as normal so that the children can play both inside and outside whilst they are here.

Along with Government guidelines, we are encouraging the children to social distance and to wash their hands more frequently, but as I am sure you can appreciate, it can sometimes prove difficult as the children are so young. Our bubble will be all the staff and children who attend and we will be keeping to the safety measures which we have sent you previously unless the Government makes any changes over the summer.

We have upped our cleaning routine and have anti-bacterial hand gel gloves and face masks, though we are being advised that we do not need to wear face masks unless a child is unwell and we are waiting for them to be collected or we are changing clothes, nappies etc.

If you would like to make changes to your days or have additional days, you can let us know on the visit. **If you think that you may be entitled to 30 hours funding, please ensure that you make your claim before 31st August as this is the cut-off date for the autumn term.** If you are unable to visit on Friday 4th September and you would like to change your child's days please leave a message on our answerphone

If your child or anyone in your household has symptoms of covid 19 please do not bring your child into pre-school.

We look forward to seeing you on 7th September, please try to pop in on Friday 4th September, all staff will be here to welcome you and the children and we can answer any questions you may have.
